CAMP PACKING LIST

- Limit one suitcase, one small carry bag

Required/Necessary Items

- Closed toe athletic shoes

- Toiletries
- Flashlight

Highly Recommended Items

Dress Code Highlights

- Wear comfortable, modest clothing that you can be active in and that can get dirty
- Bathing suits: one piece or modest tankini for girls or a two-piece with a shirt over it; swimming trunks for boys, no speedos.
- Students should have clothes that work with a full body harness (clothes that won't ride up!)
- No clothing with questionable or inappropriate sayings, slogans, etc.
- No clothing that promotes alcohol, cigarettes, drugs or any other inappropriate items

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DO NOT BRING

- Anything you have to hide
- Items that cannot be easily replaced
- Weapons, pocketknives, etc.
- Electronics
- Alcohol
- Tobacco, Juuls, vapes, illegal substances
- Drones

MEDICATIONS

- **ANY MEDICATION** sent with your student to camp **MUST BE CHECKED-IN at the nurse station** on the day we leave for camp.
- You need a copy of the PVC Medication form completed prior to check-in. Medications must be in their original container inside a clearly marked Ziplock bag. Put the copy of the form in the Ziplock bag.
- If your student uses a pill organizer, include a written description and dosage of each medication.
- All medications will be stored in a locked container and administered by our camp nurse or leadership staff.

PVC Student Ministries Youth Code of Conduct:

During the meetings and events under the sponsorship and guidance of Park Valley Church, I recognize that I am a representative of the Christian Community and I am responsible for my actions. I understand that by signing this code of conduct, I agree to abide by the following guidelines:

I Shall:

1. Recognize that everyone in the group is a part of the body of Christ. I will embrace inclusiveness by making sure that everyone feels welcome and important.
2. Respect the physical and emotional well-being of others by “doing unto them as I would have them do unto me.” (This includes refraining from harsh play or violence, refraining from harmful jokes, refraining from misuse of technology, etc.)
3. Respect the health of my own body by refraining from the use of tobacco, alcohol, vapes, e-cigs, and illegal drugs. I understand that the use of these substances is absolutely prohibited and will result in being sent home from the event.
4. Respect the things I use and the property of places I visit. The areas used for all events, including transportation, shall be left clean.
5. Act appropriately with members of the opposite sex. This means no couples alone at any time, and no public displays of affection or sexual activity.
6. Follow all instructions given by group leaders and chaperones without protest. (This does not mean an instruction cannot be politely and discretely questioned if it seems unreasonable).
7. Participate fully in ALL scheduled group activities and abide by additional group guidelines set for the event, including remaining within the group or assigned sub-group always. I will not wander off alone or leave the activity site unless granted permission by an adult, and I will report for all designated check-in times.
8. Hold safety in the highest regard and refrain from compromising my own safety or another's safety.
9. Provide a trusting environment for my peers. When others share something about themselves in a group discussion, I will not repeat that information to other friends outside of the group.
10. Leave all cell phones, tablets, and other electronics either at home or in the designated location and will only use these devices when allowed.

Guidelines for Consequences: Consequences will focus on restoring peace with reconciliation among the parties involved. The goal of resolving each problem will be growth and learning through repentance and forgiveness. Any problems encountered will be handled within the group and by the adult leaders to the extent that this is possible. However, should a situation persist or become uncontrollable, the parent/guardian will be contacted and informed of the problem. Should the situation be urgent, the parent/guardian will be contacted immediately and will be responsible for picking up the youth from the event or providing for his/her transportation home.

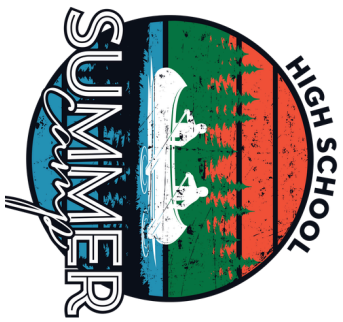
